



You are going to give presentations at the end of the Summer School. Some students like to dress up for that. However, there is no dress code at our University.



Corrensstraße 25, Münster






The building is devided in 4 sections (A, B, C and D), and so are the Rooms numbered. For example:







BUS LEAVING FROM "CHERUSKERRING A" AT:



#### **SOME FACTS:**

- 300,000 residents 50,000 are students
- City of culture 5 theatres, 28 museums and exhibition halls, etc.
- Green city castle park, botanic gardens, promenade,...
- Historic City First mentioned in 793, when Frisian missionary Liudger founded the "Monasterium" (cloister)
- Well known as the "City of the Westphalian Peace" where the peace treaty was signed after the thirty years war in 1648
